

# *Daventry by Rail?*



*Back for 2017  
– the Coventry  
Connection!*



Our weekend venue, the Mercure Daventry Court Hotel & Spa, has easy access by car but for delegates coming by train the situation is very different as the nearest stations are some miles distant and bus links are generally inconvenient.

So once again this year we are planning to provide a FREE coach from Coventry railway station to Daventry on Friday afternoon, and returning to Coventry at the conclusion of the weekend.

## *Why Coventry?*

Coventry is served by direct trains from London, Manchester, Glasgow and Bournemouth – and of course Birmingham (New Street). Trains from Edinburgh and the North East, the South West and Wales have convenient connections in Birmingham, whilst trains from East Anglia afford connections via Nuneaton or Birmingham.

Within the space of half an hour, from 2.20 to 2.50 pm there are arrivals at Coventry from Manchester, Bournemouth (via Reading and Oxford), Glasgow and Nuneaton, together with several from Birmingham and a fast service from London Euston. So we are once again arranging for a coach to leave Coventry station at 3.00 pm (possibly waiting till 3.15 for late arrivals) in order to arrive at the hotel by 4.00 pm.

At the conclusion of the weekend the coach will leave the hotel by 4.00 pm and should arrive at Coventry station by 5.00 pm. There should be onward connections to most destinations, but times should be checked nearer the date in case of alterations for weekend engineering work.

We will assume that you wish to use the coach in both directions unless you indicate otherwise. This is important as one of the coach passengers will act as courier and check names against a list to ensure that no-one is left behind.
